Weather delayed our trip to Slavin Ranch Conservation Area by a day but it turned out well in the long run. The migrating song birds along the wooded trail towards the lake were in good numbers and not at all timid. Among other species, we saw both the Golden-crowned and the Ruby-crowned Kinglet, a Wilson's Warbler, a White-breasted Nuthatch and a Merlin eating a small bird. The lake is now a series of ponds due to the lack of rain and held a variety of wading and shore birds plus the usual waterfowl. We spent time trying to identify a sandpiper, no easy task, and felt satisfied that we had a Solitary Sandpiper. A distant Snipe that refused to give us a profile presented a challenge but when the famous beak came into view we had him!

After we had finished with Slavin Ranch we decided to head out to Sprague Lake on the chance of finding the Great Egrets seen there the previous day. No luck with that but the sky was filled with swallows - Violet-green, Barn, and Northern Rough-winged. It was a day well spent.
